For a Mental Health Emergency:

Valley Creek Crisis Intervention is a free, 24/7 service for all county residents regardless of insurance status. Calls are confidential and may be anonymous. Located at 469 Creamery Way, Exton • **Crisis Hot Line: (610) 280-3270** or toll free at **877-918-2100**.

A consumer-run **Warm Line** is for non-emergency conversations with trained Certified Peer Specialists: 1-866-846-2722.

Valley Creek Crisis Center provides: Telephone Crisis Counseling • Walk-In Center • Community-Based Mobile Outreach • Adult Crisis Residential Program, which provides short-term (up to 10 days) voluntary residential care to help stabilize individuals in a mental health crisis, and help avoid hospitalization.

Non-Emergency Treatment Services in Chester County:

Core providers (which are facilities that provide administrative direction, coordination of care and clinical services) will do the preliminary assessment of a person's mental health and recovery needs. These core provider agencies are **listed in bold** (under child and adult services) below and will develop a service plan so you can get the help you need.

If you have Medical Assistance, call Community Care Behavioral Health at 1-866-622-4228.

The customer service representatives can offer referrals to providers for inpatient and outpatient psychiatric services.

Have you or a loved one experienced trauma?

Chester County Mental Health and Drug & Alcohol providers have been trained in various types effective trauma treatment. Please inquire when you call, or contact Chester County Department of Mental Health/Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities at the number above.

In PA, most children under age 19 with serious emotional & behavioral concerns will qualify for services covered by Medical Assistance, regardless of family income.

Mental Health Recovery Court - This is a collaboration of the Departments of Mental Health and Criminal Justice that assists adult Chester County residents with serious mental illness arrested for criminal charges, yet ***do not pose a risk to public safety***. The objective is to have the arrested person pursue intensive mental health services instead of facing prosecution.

Crossroads Recovery Center (*through Horizon House, Inc.*)

This center is run by certified peer specialists and individuals who have experienced mental health challenges. It is open to those 18 and older who are seeking connection to services, supports, and other adults using mental health services. The facility offers a computer lab, activities, support groups, a resource library, laundry room, shower and more. The center also houses other mental health programs, including the Stages Arts Initiative, which provides programming for creative enrichment and wellbeing through music and art.
